The Maungaraki Community Association has lodged a submission in response to the Council's proposed District Plan change which, if passed, will make housing in Intensification in Maungaraki much easier.

Our submission focussed on the character of Maungaraki which is its predominantly low density housing, pleasant visual surroundings, and vegetation. This provides a calming and peaceful backdrop for residents which could be spoilt forever with higher intensification of housing.

We also reminded the Council that the Western Escarpment, of which Maungaraki is a part of, is recognised in the Wellington Regional Policy statement as an outstanding natural feature. This is an asset for the whole city and should be protected

Maungaraki School's Y5/6 Rippa Rugby team have pulled off a stunning final win against Muritai in double over-time to take top honours at the recent Lower Hutt Primary School Sports Association Interzone Tournament at Hutt Park. Having swept South-West Zone with a perfect 5-0 record. Maungaraki's coach, Newton King was confident his side had what it took to go all the way at Interzone. The game eventually came down to a few turnovers as Eastern Hutt knocked the ball

"We needed to play well and we did. We got a roll-on early and kept it up for the majority of the match. When you score 11 tries in 14 mins of game time, you are not doing much wrong." Said a pleased coach King. Maungaraki and Muritai would play in the LHPSSA Interzone Rippa Rugby 2018 final.

Muritai entered the final as hot favourites and got off to a fast start, scoring twice in the first few minutes, before Maungaraki came back to level the score. The lead changed several times as both high-powered offences couldn't gain ascendency over the other. Maungaraki's defence led by Thomas, Harrison, Storm & Cole began to wear down Muritai's vaunted attack, led by their Interzone track star winger Aubery Changa. Muritai had one final attack repelled on the line by Maungaraki's swarming defence to force the game into overtime. Muritai's game plan was simple. Keep giving the ball to their star winger, whilst Maungaraki's was just as clear. Stop him. At 45-45 the game headed into double overtime. Maungarak pounced on a turnover opening 10pt lead, Muritai scored again to send the game into a thrilling climax. The final play of the game saw Muritai's star winger running down the sideline Maungaraki defenders coverging diving at his rips to make the final rip. When the final whistle sounded the Maungaraki
