Coro St for Maungaraki?

The Hutt City Council have released a proposed District Plan change on residential housing which, if passed, could have major implications for Maungaraki.

Under the guise of a 'review of the existing General Residential Activity Area', it is proposing to allow 'comprehensive development' on a 1,400m3 lot within the general residential zone anywhere in Hutt City.

Media reported that the council was considering allowing for this type of housing in Lower Hutt, but it was assumed HCC would carefully assess suitable areas of the City for this type of development. Such an assumption has proven to be misguided as HCC has now decided this type of development can be built anywhere



Do residents want high-density housing like this? in Hutt City. Given the serious impact this change to the district play potentially has for Maungaraki, the Maungaraki Community Association (MCA) is holding a public meeting on Wednesday February 21st at 7:30pm at the Community Centre.



Gimme Shelter

As you may be aware Maungaraki's bus shelter opposite the Maungaraki shops, and at the top of Dowse Drive were upgraded recently. While welcome, no one was aware these new shelters were coming so enquires were made with the Regional Council.

They advised bus shelters are replaced when they reach or are nearing the end of their useful life, as maintenance costs become unviable to repair long term and there is greater value-for-money to erect a new shelter.

Each year the GWRC transport staff assesses all of the shelters and records a condition rating, 1 to 5 based on the condition of the asset. This, along with data regarding the date each bus shelter was installed and feedback from GWRC's maintenance contractor provides information to help GWRC decide which bus shelters should be replaced. Patronage levels and future plans for bus routes are also considered during the assessment.

So, the two shelters which were replaced in Maungaraki were clearly at the end of their useful lives.

So what about new shelters? GWRC says that when deciding where to install new bus shelters they use a prioritisation system to help manage their limited budget. They go on to explain prioritisation looks at the location of the stop (i.e. proximity to community facilities, shops, hospitals etc.), the function of the bus stop (i.e. can customers transfer between services here/how many services use the stop a day), as well as how many customers are using the stop, the number of requests for a shelter and population growth forecasts, median age data, and deprivation index data for the local area.

Basedon2016 passenger data, the next two busiest bus stops in Maungaraki are; Dowse Drive at Acacia Avenue (near 215): 315 passengers & Acacia Avenue at Camellia Terrace (near 25): 264 passengers. This compares to 747 passengers at the Maungaraki shops stop and 462 opposite the shops where the new shelter was installed.

The MCA intends to make further enquiries with GWRC to ascertain where Acacia Avenue's Bus Stop





ranks in their assessments for new Bus Shelters. Based on GWRC's own criteria and that they take into account the number of requests for a particular shelter. We should not hesitate to make a case that Maungaraki deserves more high-quality Bus Shelters based on the 2016 data.
