Meeting draws good support

Maungaraki Community Association recently hosted a well-attended public meeting on the Hutt City Council's proposed District Plan change.

Many people throughout our neighbourhood and Hutt City have been unaware that some of the proposed planning changes to residential areas apply throughout the City, not just the nine targeted areas that have received most of the publicity. The meeting heard that infill housing could be built on any sized section.

Previously, it required that a section size be a minimum of 800 sqm plus a driveway before it could be subdivided. While these sub-divisions are proposed to be discretionary, the new rules will certainly make them easier to occur in Maungaraki than is currently the case. Comprehensive

development on a section size of at least 1,400 sqm will be permitted and can be as high as 10 metres, up from the existing 8 metres, whilst covering 60% of the site compared to 35% at present.

Such developments are likely to be expensive in Maungaraki, given the value of housing at present and the earth works required. However,



the proposed rules will make such developments easier to be built in Maungaraki.

It was agreed for the Maungaraki Community Association to make a submission on the proposed plan change. Concerns raised at the meeting were the potential for the 'character' of Maungaraki to be lost, increased traffic during the morning rush hour, less parking and less safer and efficient use of local roads.

The MCA would like to thank Environmental Planner Jenny Grimmett for attending and explaining many of the technical issues surrounding the plan change and the general district plan process which is a highly complex system.

Hutt City Councillors Margaret Cousins, Chris Milne, Josh Briggs and Simon Edwards were also present at the meeting, with each making helpful contributions to help ascertain greater clarification of the proposal and how best for the MCA and others to prepare submissions. National MP Chris Bishop was also in attendence.

The MCA would like to especially thank Paul Matthews for chairing and helping make the meeting run smoothly. We are fortunate to live in a community where we are able to meet and discuss matters of importance to us. *By Max Shierlaw*.
