## EV charge stations are coming



Electric vehicle charging stations are coming to Maungaraki Shopping Centre

Hutt City Council has secured cofunding from the Government's Low Emission Vehicles Contestable Fund to install 20 charging stations for electric vehicles across eight locations in Lower Hutt, including Maungaraki.

The new charging stations will add to the six fast charging units already in place across Lower Hutt. Together these will create a charging network to facilitate 'neighbourhood' travel by residents and other drivers from throughout the region.

"Expanding the electric vehicle (EV) charging network will give people more confidence to invest in EVs, knowing the infrastructure is there to support them if they choose to go electric," says Cr Josh Briggs.



# Naenae Pool & Petone Wharf set to cost \$90 million. Rates set to increase 6%

Despite 51% of the city's residents who provided feedback on the Petone Wharf repair project saying they'd prefer it be delayed for a decade, Hutt City Council is moving ahead with plans to fast-track repairs at a cost of \$21 million.

Councillors have also agreed on increasing rates by 5.9 per cent annually over the next three years and then bumping them by 7.0 per cent each year until 2031.

In the year beginning July 1, Hutt residents will have to pay an additional \$249 for a new rubbish and recycling service in addition to the increase. From next year, the cost will be included in general rates.

A lot has been said already about council's new rubbish and recycling services. Some of the feedback has been positive, but most of it has been on the negative side as local businesses were sold out to foreign suppliers. Unfortunately, it seems the 'Support Local, Shop Local' campaign (https://www.support-

local.nz/) fell on deaf ears with councillors. With the Naenae Pool rebuild set to cost \$68 million and now Petone Wharf at \$21 million, Maungaraki ratepayers will be paying higher rates for years to come. With council elections just over a year away, these issues will no-doubt become key election issues. Maungaraki Views wants to know how our readers feel about these decisions and paying higher rates. 
