Cross Valley Link put on back burner



The sight of heavy commercial trucks clogging up the esplanade is here to stay

The much talked about Cross Valley Link road to help ease congestion between Seaview & Gracefield to State Highway 2 won't be completed by Hutt City Council until 2032/2033, as outlined in the Cross Valley Connections transport programme. It shows the link road isn't likely to commence until 2027 with cycle and walking, and public transport projects now taking priority. This decision does seem a tad ironic as this council has touted

population and housing growth from the beginning of its election cycle, yet when the opportunity to make a significant change to better move traffic from east to west, it has instead chosen to re-prioritise a logical transport solution in favour of a costlier long-term 'micromobility' green approach. Council's head of transport, Jon Kingsbury, said public transport and micromobility routes for the



likes of bikes and scooters would make the Cross Valley Link road more viable. "We need to give people the option of cycling and walking. [These projects] will take pressure off our roads and reduce emissions."

Given how bad the Hutt Valley's Winter and Spring weather conditions have become over recent years, I wonder just how many of cyclists and walkers will actually utilise these micromobility routes on a day to day basis. It seems bad weather conditions aren't a consideration when these decisions

are made. The Cross Valley Link would, in theory, take pressure of the Petone Esplanade where traffic from Wainuiomata, and the Seaview and Gracefield industrial areas is frequently reduced to a crawl. With Transmission Gully to be opened next year, fingers crossed x 1.3 billion, wouldn't it make better sense to give motorists and more importantly truck drivers the ability to access SH2 and SH1 more directly via the CVL road. whilst easing congestion along the Esplanade in the process? If this is the case, why wait 10 years for it to become a reality? Ed.
