Alicetown Fire Station closure puts Maungaraki homes at greater risk

Homes, businesses and lives are at greater risk folloing the closure of Hutt City Fire Station on Marsden St. Alicetown, because it's roof required fixing.

as fire crews are travelling farther and are taking longer to respond to emergencies.

The NZ Professional Firefighters Union (NZPFU) says it is taking up to 10 minutes longer to get to parts of the southern Hutt Valley after the "Ten minutes is a long time when vou can't breathe, or your house is burning down," said secretary of the NZPFU Wellington local branch Alan Collett.

Crews covering central Lower Hutt and the Western Hills now had to come from Avalon Fire Station. approximately five kilometres north.

The southern part of the valley was not being as effectively served as it had been when the station was open. Crews also responded to medical events, and longer response times meant the community was waiting longer for potentially life-saving services.

After 15 years a location for a new station was still yet to be identified.

Fire and Emergency Wellington district manager Nick Pyatt in a statement said "between the crews based at Avalon and Seaview fire stations, the Lower Hutt community can be assured they will get assistance from Fire and Emergency when it's needed".

The issues with Hutt City Fire Station's roof were yet to be resolved. "We are actively working through what the resolution will be for our Hutt City crews, and what this means for Hutt City fire station." Credit, Matthew Tso, Stuff.

Hutt Park Run 10th Anniversary

On 7 May the Lower Hutt parkrun will have its 10th anniversary.

The free weekly 5km walk-jog-run event takes place at 8am every Saturday morning. The course starts and finishes at the south end of the riverbank carpark, and is entirely on the riverbank path or grass.

Lower Hutt parkrun was the first parkrun event in NZ, and is organised and attended by many Maungaraki locals. Since 2012 another 35 parkrun locations have been set up around NZ.

In the last ten years, 7,397 people have finished the Lower Hutt parkrun, and 676 awesome volunteers have made 480 individual events happen.

Our official Lower Hutt parkrun anniversary is scheduled for the first Saturday in May (7th May 2022). There will be laughter, fancy dress, cake, and of course a community volunteer-led, free, 5k walk-jog-run on the riverbank. www.parkrun.co.nz/lowerhutt
