Melling to Petone walking/cycleway opens

Recently, the Melling to Petone shared path opened, part of the Te Ara Tupua walking and cycling link between Central Hutt. Eastbourne, and Wellington City. Despite delays and cost overruns, funded by Waka Kotahi and Hutt City Council, it's a significant project.

However, some cyclists express safety concerns, particularly regarding the section through the Petone car park, likening it to mixing "wolves and mice." Despite these worries, cyclists like Larri Wallbridge plan to use it regularly.

High-profile cyclist Paul Kennett sees it as a valuable asset, predicting increased ridership once the Petone to Ngauranga section opens in 2026. Mark Renall praises the path's safety and usability, though acknowledging the need for cyclist-pedestrian cooperation. Dave Appleyard of Hutt Rotary

emphasizes its benefits for less confident cyclists and older users.

Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency expects significant usage once the full link is complete. Hutt City Mayor Campbell Barry hails the path as crucial infrastructure for changing transportation habits in Hutt. However, the project's costs have ballooned to \$65 million, making it one of the country's most expensive cycleways. What do you think about the new walkway/cycleway? Consultation open for accessibility improvements to Jackson Street bus stops

Metlink seeks input on proposed upgrades for Jackson Street bus stops in Petone, aimed at enhancing safety and accessibility. The \$9 million project, part of Waka Kotahi's \$350 million Transport Choices program, focuses on improving public transport infrastructure to accommodate future demand and reduce reliance on cars. Greater Wellington **Transport Committee Chair Thomas** Nash lauds the initiative for its climate-friendly investments.

Metlink emphasizes the importance of feedback to improve bus stops, prioritizing accessibility for all passengers, including those with bikes, prams, or wheelchairs. The project targets stops 8005 (near Petone police station), 9005 (near Britannia Street corner), and 8006 (near Subway and Hell Pizza) on
