

Mayor reassures community after two tragic deaths

Police have not released the names of the two people killed in Lower Hutt yesterday. A woman died in a hit-and-run in Naenae, while a man was shot by police after holding his partner hostage in Wainuiomata

Mayor Campbell Barry reassured the community that these separate incidents are rare and that police are working hard to resolve them

Investigations are ongoing, and police are seeking information on a stolen dark-grey Mazda 6 sedan involved in the hit-and-run. The woman involved in the Wainuiomata incident is safe. Wainuiomata Marae manager Lynda Olsen expressed community shock and a desire for non-lethal police responses. Ed.

3 burst pipes cuts water supply to 6 local streets

Water service has now been fully restored to Maungaraki streets Mulberry St, Hibiscus Gr, Chestnut Gr, Jacaranda Gr, Barberry Gr, Bushey Way and 1-120, 181 to 193 Dowse Drive and Magnolia Grove and Walnut Way.

Wellington Water crews were called to three burst water pipes in Maungaraki last night. 6 streets had to be cut off whilst repairs were carried out. 2 water tankers were on site to provide water to affected residents.

Please run a cold tap for a few minutes to clear any air pockets or cloudy water from your pipes before using hot taps, dishwashers and washing machines. Please do not run hot taps, to make sure your hot water cylinder doesn't run dry Thank you for your patience. Ed.

Lower Hutt Mayor Campbell Barry stated that the city cannot afford to fix its failing infrastructure, with a backlog of 236 km of pipe needing renewal. The Wellington region's for the issue, but Wellington Water suggests this should be \$7.6 billion

This increase is unaffordable with current funding tools, leading to double-digit rate rises and councils reaching their debt caps. Barry emphasised the need for a new funding model and urgent government collaboration to avoid astronomical rate increases and address decades of underinvestment.

Infrastructure Costs: The situation in Lower Hutt is dire, as it grapples with the inability to repair its failing infrastructure. A staggering 236 km of pipe urgently needs renewal, and the costs are spiralling out of control.



Funding Shortfall: The funding gap in the Wellington region is not just significant, it's alarming. The current plan of \$1.9 billion falls far short of the mark, with Wellington long-term plan allocates \$1.9 billion Water estimating a staggering \$7.6 billion is actually needed.

> **Debt Limits and Rate Increases:** The current situation is not

sustainable. Councils are rapidly approaching their debt limits and are considering double-digit rate increases. This is a clear sign that a new funding model is urgently needed.

Call for New Funding Model:

Mayor Barry urges the government to collaborate on a new funding mechanism to spread costs over time.

Urgency Needed: Immediate action is required to avoid significant rate increases and address underinvestment challenges, which could lead to water service outages. Ed.
