# Hutt City Council is planning a 12.8% rates increase next year

The Hutt City Council's 2025-26 draft Annual Plan prioritises essential services, key projects, and responsible cost management while keeping rates as affordable as possible. To ease the financial impact on residents, the Council reduced the proposed rates increase from 13.4% (in the Long-Term Plan) to 12.8%. For an average residential home, this means an additional \$9.06 per week

Mayor Campbell Barry emphasised that economic pressures were central to the Council's decision-making.

"We understand that any rates increase will be challenging as households continue to face financial strain. At the same time, the Council must manage its own



rising costs while ensuring the city continues to grow and improve."

"Infrastructure remains our top priority, particularly water services, which account for 53% of the proposed rates increase," Mayor Barry said. As Lower Hutt's population is expected to reach 125,000 by 2033, the Council is planning ahead to meet future demands while protecting essential services and the environment. Ed.
